Treasurer report. Balance in checking as of 5-23-24 was \$3108.

Food for meeting paid 8-1-24 was \$110.

Becker Soil and Water will not place another inspector here unless the AIS inspector requests this lake. This information was provided by Becker County Soil and Water.

Information update was given on cannabis sales. There will be no change in the setback on sales which is 1000feet for schools, churches and day care centers. However growing of cannabis has a 100 foot setback. This information was provided by the Detroit Lakes paper.
